National Apprenticeship Week (5 - 11 February 2004) provided a great opportunity to think about future careers and to raise awareness of the different options available after college, via apprenticeships.



APPRENTICESHIP VACANCIES

Encourage your son/daughter to explore live vacancies so they can see what opportunities are are available locally to help inform any decisions or plans they might like to make:

- Search by interest and postcode
- Visit college and training provider websites
- Visit employer websites
- Talk to family and friends and ask around about opportunities



NATIONAL CAREERS WEEK

National Careers Week (4 - 9 March 2004) is a celebration of careers guidance. Its aim is to provide a focus for careers guidance activity at an important stage in the academic calendar to help support young people to develop awareness and excitement about their future pathways.

Students will be supported in college to explore their options and develop their independence in making decisions about their future. You are also encouraged to support your son / daughter by continuing conversations at home. This could include:

- Talking about the jobs family and friends have had, both the highs and lows.
- Asking to see your child's CV and helping them shout about their skills and think of examples they can use to showcase their strengths. They can create a CV using Unifrog (our careers platform).
- Encouraging them to think about volunteering or part-time work.
- Researching jobs available locally to help understand if they are making realistic decisions about their future plans. Have they looked at the skills and qualifications they might need and if they need to think about travelling further afield for work, training and/or study.
- Accessing the <u>virtual NCW Fair</u>
- Visiting the local <u>Humber Outreach Programme</u> floor of the NCW fair.
- Encouraging your son/daughter to complete this short online course through Unifrog to help create a career goal and plan.
- Asking you child what their plans are for next year. If they can't answer this they can book a 1:1 careers meeting by emailing careers@riseholme.ac.uk.

Hosted by broadcaster and journalist, Rachel Burden, the Parent Podcast is a great starting point to help support your son/daughter with careers education and guidance and how to make more informed career decisions with greater confidence, knowledge and understanding.
